Dear Parents of Kindergartners:

We are so excited about beginning a new school year and having your children in our kindergarten program. We look forward to working together with each of you!

There are several supplies that your child will need to bring on Orientation Night. Each child will need:

- 1) 2 large erasers
- 2) a spiral-bound notebook to be used as a daily journal
- 3) 1 box of 24 count Crayola crayons
- 4) 1 set of Crayola twistable crayons
- 5) 4 boxes of washable Crayola markers – classic colors: two fine point, two fat point
- 6) 1 pair of FrisKars scissors
- 7) 10 glue sticks
- 8) 2 bottles of Elmers glue
- 9) 1 pkg. of construction paper (assorted colors)
- 10) 3 sturdy pocket folders WITH POCKETS ON BOTTOM (design or plain)
- 11) 3 tubs of antibacterial handwipes
- 12) 1 box tissues
- 13) 1 disposable camera
- 14) 1 box of gallon Ziploc bags (BOYS)
1 box of sandwich Ziploc bags (GIRLS)
- 15) small plastic school box WITHOUT HANDLES
- 16) 1 Nap mat (*optional: *small pillow, *snuggle toy, *small blanket)
- 17) An extra change of clothes (Please label the clothes and put them in a Ziploc bag with you child's name on the outside of the bag.)

ADDITIONAL SUPPLIES:

Ø PARENTS, we are requesting the use of a specific pencil. TCS will provide pencils for Kindergarten. Bring \$6.00 to TCS OFFICE and you will receive 3 dozen pencils. Additional pencils can be purchased from office throughout the year.

Each child will bring his/her lunch and drink each day.

We will have a short rest time each day, and if your child has one favorite toy or a small pillow, you may send this. You also need to send a kindergarten mat for your child to rest on (NO COMFORTERS OR SLEEPING BAGS, PLEASE!!).

The children will have a weekly show and tell (day to be announced). Please help your child select one item to share with the class. The children really enjoy this, and it encourages good speaking and listening skills.

We will also need some parent volunteers to help with holiday classroom parties and will have information about this at the Orientation Meeting, Thursday, August 14.

First graders will need the following school supplies by August 14, 2008:

- Ruler (12 in., inches and centimeters/millimeters marked on opposite sides)

- 6 folders with prongs and pockets
- 1 School box WITH NO HANDLES (long, narrow school boxes that can hold a ruler work better than organizer bags or the large boxes)

- 1 pkg. of index notebook dividers
- 1 durable (laminated) pocket folder for homework
- 1 pkg. pencils (All 7th & 8th grade English and math/Algebra must be done
in pencil)
- 1 ruler (inches and centimeters)
- 4 packs 3 x 5 index cards
- 1 student dictionary (not optional)
- 1 box of tissues, preferably in a rectangular box (easier to store)
Please send only one box; we'll use what we have and request more
if necessary.
- 1 pack of colored pencils
- 1 pkg. of cap erasers
- Brown paper grocery bags or manufactured book covers to cover five
textbooks

Dear Parents of High Schoolers (9th through 12th Grades):

The high school faculty looks forward to teaching your children this year. Below is a list of school supplies your child(ren) will need:

- pencils
- colored pencils
- pens - blue or black only
- red pens for corrections
- 3 "marble" composition books for note taking (outside reading)
- 5 loose-leaf, 3-ring binders (1 1/2" – 2"; prefer hard cover)
- notebook filler paper, college rule
- 1 one-subject spiral-bound notebook for Bible class
- tabbed index dividers to separate class notes from handouts, returned papers, etc. (Must be 3-ring to fit in notebooks)
- ruler with both English and metric markings
- protractor
- compass
- Office edition American Heritage Dictionary, 3rd edition, or a comparably good High School/College student dictionary
- 5 book covers

FOR 9th - 12th GRADERS: For Algebra I a scientific calculator with trigonometric functions: Sin, Cos, Tan. Solar is best. The TI-30XA is one that you might find readily available. For Algebra II, Advanced Math and Calculus a TI-83plus graphing calculator – about \$99. (Check Pawn Shops and GSU Bookstore for used)

ALL SCIENCE STUDENTS need a separate science notebook with dividers

10th AND 12th GRADERS need colored pencils for Anatomy and Biology

SPANISH I and II STUDENTS need English/Spanish Dictionary
